Bruntsfield Links that many of the very useful signs indicating the names of the paths have gone missing for one reason or another, or in such a terrible state that they should be replaced. On a recent visit I found no signs at all in Bruntsfield Links!

Even more interestingly, some paths may never have been named, Like the one from Livingstone place to the Boroughloch (unless you know better – if so PLEASE get in touch and FoMBL)



The first mention of the Pavilion in the Council records

was in March 1904 when Bailie McMichael moved "Remit to the Lord Provost's and Public Parks Committees to consider and report upon the erection of a combined Band Stand and Cricketers' Pavilion in the West Meadow Park".

The next reference was on 26 April 1904: 28). read the following Report by the Public Parks Committee, on motion by Bailie M'Michael as to the erection of a Cricketers' Pavilion in the West Meadows Park - "The Public Parks Committee, having considered this motion and examined sketch plans submitted, beg to recommend the Magistrates and Council to authorise the erection of a cricketers' pavilion in the West Meadows Park at a probable cost of £450, and they crave a remit to obtain estimates for this work"

A notice in The Scotsman of 15 July 1904

West Meadows Cricket Pavilion
THE NEW PAVILION WILL BE opened
ON SATURDAY
FIRST the 16th instant at 2.45 o'clock
Afternoon. Thomas Hunter Town Clerk
City Chambers 14 July 1904

The original photograph (above) seemed to me to show not all the present building

and I have discovered that the "wings" were added in 1938, building warrant being dated 22 January "to erect 2 Pavilions"

Further references have been scarce but I intend to do further research. At this time there was quite a spate of pavilion building, and the one in Kirriemuir, for instance, is listed. Another, also with razor wire about it,

to deter vandals, it is in Campbell Park. There seems to have been some influence of the Arts and Crafts architectural movement in the design. It is in very good fundamental condition, despite the neglect of the Council over many years. Due largely to our pressure, some remedial work has now been completed, by the re-slating of part of the roof, to make it water-tight, and the cleaning up of the kitchen and toilet which now works! Not however to a level you would consider in your home, unless you like a 1904 sink and tap, but it is a start, repainting is to take place in dark green, and proposals for its further use, including the request by a private individual for the operation of a café, are being considered.

It is in my view a meritorious building and it would be a pity if it were not brought more and better into use, and not be demolished as the Council at first seemed to want, as happened to the Band Stand, which older members may just remember. There is to be a full refurbishment assessment, but we have been warned the Council will not "pour" money into it if continual vandalism takes place.

Any further suggestions or information will be warmly welcomed.
