Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

During the past year we have achieved much in the way of improving the environment. First, we obtained funding from the South Central Neighbourhood Partnership for a new double-sized noticeboard, which has been installed at a crucial entry point to the Meadows, at the north entrance to Middle Meadow Walk, where hundreds of people pass daily. We also gained funding for a new garden and minibandstand in the same location.

We have continued to recruit volunteers for monthly work parties, and have achieved much in the way of tidying up the parks (litter picking, autumn leaf gathering, tree feathering, path edging, bulb planting, etc.) Some of this work (path edging) reduces the need for weedkiller to be used. We have also worked with a local school, George Heriot's, who have brought along Primary 6 children to help with various gardening tasks. The children have enjoyed the work.

Our voluntary work has been enhanced by the contribution of students from Edinburgh University, and our membership has doubled with the recruitment of all the students resident in Wrights Houses, which looks out onto Bruntsfield Links.

We have held three public meetings during the year: the first outlining the plan for the garden mentioned above; the second an illustrated talk by Anna Canning of Floramedica entitled 'People Plants Places' about edible plants on the Meadows, and the third by Leonie Alexander from the Royal Botanic Gardens on the subject: 'Making the Meadows and Bruntsfield Links better for biodiversity'
