Convener's Comment

Charitable status

The group Friends of the Meadows and Bruntsfield Links (FoMBL) was founded in 2001, with a comprehensive constitution that has undeniably charitable purposes. However, we have never become a registered charity. Your committee feels that the time has come to seek charitable status, since among other things this will make it much easier to gain funding for our projects (sadly, WREN turned down our request to fund the Barclay Corner). Also, any donations will qualify for Gift Aid, and charities are exempt from VAT. The new Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organization (SCIO) is simpler than the old kind of charity, and very suitable for small organizations such as our own. We hope very much that all members will agree at the AGM that this is the way forward. Do come along and support us.

Another attraction at our AGM is a talk by Lord Fraser of Carmyllie on his scheme for a memorial to General Maczek on the Links, near where he used to live in Marchmont (see p. 3 for a taster to whet your appetite for more). There will also be the traditional croquet prelude to the main meeting.

Barbecues

After our long, cold, wet winter the barbecue season is finally upon us. You may be aware that at our public meeting in March the motion to provide more barbecue slabs was narrowly defeated: in fact the opposition voted to ban barbecues altogether. This might be a step too far, and in any case the slabs remain: but we are pleased to say that MABLAG (The Meadows and Bruntsfield Links Advisory Group) voted to remove all slabs sited around the golf courses and reposition them near to North Meadow Walk, within reach of the new silo bin with its companion barbecue bin. This is obviously an improvement, since golfers and cricketers will no longer be in conflict with barbecuers. A circular has also been sent to all Edinburgh University students to alert them to the Park Rules on the subject. We hope therefore that future barbecues will be held responsibly. We are also promised another Park Ranger to help with enforcement of the Rules.

Giant Chessboard

A recent venture of the Council has been the installation of a giant chessboard within the play park at the east end of the Meadows. This needs to be booked five days in advance from Mike Shields (mike.shields@edinburgh.gov.uk), giving details of the school, club or group. Giant chess pieces are available for loan, free of charge, but only to organizations, not individuals. There is also a long-standing chessboard on the upper Links, recently repainted by our Treasurer: bring your own pieces.

Outdoor Table Tennis

In similar vein, our member Nick Lilwall is proposing a scheme for funding an outdoor table tennis table, near the existing chessboard, within the playground area at the east end of the Meadows. Outdoor table tennis tables in parks and playgrounds are a common feature in cities like Berlin. Edinburgh already has one in King George V Park, but Nick thinks we need lots more. He writes:

'Young people need to be encouraged to take up this exciting sport, which featured in the London Olympics and will be part of next year's Commonwealth Games. These outdoor tables are made of concrete and cost £1,500 - £2,000, plus an additional £500 for installation. Good news: recycling

We are glad to report that the site on the corner of Whitehouse Loan and Bruntsfield Crescent to replace that in Warrender Park Road, which was set up without proper local consultation, has now been reinstated, apart from some planting of grass and bulbs, which will be done shortly. There is now more kerbside recycling, and we also have two silo bins on the Meadows and Links, which take everything. Even better, the contents are now not going to landfill but will be sorted and recycled.

A memorial to General Maczek

On 28th March Lord Fraser of Carmyllie launched a campaign for a memorial to the great Polish General Stanislaw Maczek. Although he was a brilliant General, entrusted by Sir Winston Churchill with the defences of Scotland from Nazi oppression, and he is recognized in the Netherlands for his cool courage and bluff in the Falaise Gap, when the Allied troops were otherwise pinned down by the Nazis, he has never been recognized in Scotland.

The legendary General Stanislaw Maczek was born in Poland in 1892. When he was well over 90 he received due recognition of his abilities in Poland, and HM The Queen made him a Companion of the Order of the Bath. He was admired by Field Marshall Montgomery and revered by Sir Winston Churchill. But in Scotland he lived quietly and humbly with his family in Edinburgh. He died aged 102.

The saga is fascinating. If you'd like to learn more, come to our AGM, when Lord Fraser will be telling the story in more detail, and outlining his plan for a memorial on the Links.

The Pavilion Café

You may have noticed that there has been a huge improvement to the back of the Pavilion, with a good deal of clearing of redundant branches and general tidying up. Amanda, who runs the Pavilion Café, has great schemes for using this ground productively. A wildlife corner, and low raised beds for growing herbs and vegetables, are among the plans. The idea is to demonstrate to local children the different skills and knowledge involved in these processes.

FoMBL volunteers have contributed to this work, which has already improved the area considerably. We wish Amanda well, and hope that we can continue to help.
