Donations

Money raised is used for all sorts of things that are not covered by the Edinburgh City Council. For example, it enables the volunteers to plant more bulbs, renew paving, provide information and education boards, to repaint railings, to get the correct materials to clean up graffiti.

Look out for damage to trees and verges

While you are walking around the Meadows and Bruntsfield Links, can you look out for any of the young trees which have their supports falling over? Also look out for any damaged trees. Take a photograph, showing the location with some landmarks, or street names if possible, and send it to mike.shields@edinburgh.gov.uk. We have grants for new tree planting, so it is important to make sure that we can look after them all.



Please can members help!

There is a serious problem where lorries have been driven along the narrow paths on the Meadows, leaving these conspicuous tyre gouges in soft soil beside them. This could be caused by any of the service vehicles which use the Meadows: garden maintenance, cleansing, street lighting, workshops etc. The Council has been notified, but it will be very helpful if they can identify the vehicles by the number plate or the fleet number. Photos, with landmarks or street names to help find the location, are useful. You should also contact mike.shields@edinburgh.gov.uk about this problem.
