Playgrounds

Background

Over five years ago I realised that there was a lack of play equipment for younger children (2-6) throughout the Meadows and Bruntsfield Links and as project manager for FoMBL, I set about organising the installation of new play equipment at the existing three playgrounds. With the support of council officials five pieces of such equipment have now been installed.

I realised that there was a lack of play equipment serving families who live around the South area of the Links and after consultation with local families I raised sufficient funds to install two simple pieces of wooden equipment in the form of a covered log house and a wooden train on a special safety mat.

The site chosen was considered ideal as it is a completely fenced area with one access gate thus minimising dog entry and toddler escape! There is also a FoMBL wildflower meadow which we hope can be used by the children to plant their own bulbs and seeds.

We have provided wood chip access paths to prevent damage to seeded soil as well as muddy feet! Funds were provided by a generous donation by nearby Forbes nursery, CEC community fund, the Scottish Government and FoMBL. Contractor (Landcare Solutions) organisation was by Alan Grevers of CEC.

Bird enclave



FoMBL Tree Group has been very busy during November planting hundreds of berry producing bushes and trees within the Northern area of the mid-Meadows toddlers' play park. The range of bushes and trees include wild rose, hazel, hawthorn, blackthorn, crab apple, holly, downy birch, rowan.

News from the Tree Group

The tree group has been active during the summer watering of the trees planted last year on the Meadows and Links. We started planting this autumn's trees a few weeks ago, concentrating on the Meadows area. The trees are quite small but are caged and should grow quickly. Tree species are generally native, such as oak, hawthorn, silver birch, rowan and elm. All these trees are good for wildlife and should improve the biodiversity of the park. We currently have six members and we normally meet Friday afternoon. So if you enjoy practical work please join us.

FoMBL project update 21 October 2023

History/information panels for Meadows and Bruntsfield Links Project

Silke Schneider has been appointed from Edinburgh World Heritage to complete the project, although there is no firm date for completion yet.

Playgrounds

There is a new log playhouse and train at South Links. Neil Roger will meet the Playground Officer to discuss new equipment proposed for East Meadows and Links Playground.

Benches – FoMBL Bench Project

A FoMBL member has offered to fund the restoration of another wooden bench at the toddlers' playground. FoMBL have restored three wooden benches and provided two more (CEC community grant).

Tree Group

Tree planting in the autumn – seven new trees to complete a new avenue from Warrender Park Road. Funding has been allocated for new trees to be planted along Melville Drive, awaiting approval from CEC forestry. Approval has not been given so these trees will have to be planted in the early spring after cable detectors have cleared the site.

Replacement of dead trees – approval given to replace many young trees which died due to lack of watering. Tree group has planted over 10 smaller trees to replace dead trees and will continue this planting programme throughout 2023-24.

Tree watering – over 40 trees planted at South Links and the Meadows regularly watered by FoMBL Tree Group. Thanks to regular waterers Benet Haughton, Martin Howorth and Alastair Philp with help from Mihaela, Anka Bremer, Keith Gifford, Amanda Lake, Felix Lake, Oliver Roger, Mr and Mrs Braunholtz.

Post restoration – FoMBL Tree Group have reclaimed over 100 posts which have rotted at the soil ends, by removing rot, sharpening and applying preservative, saving CEC a large sum of money!

Water bowsers – FoMBL have purchased a second bowser which we hope can be stored in a new store at the Bruntsfield public toilets. We hope to install a second store at the East public toilets giving us water facilities at three locations.

Wildflower Meadows

Links fenced area – volunteers have been tending the wildflower meadow regularly over the summer – lots of oxeye daisy, red and white campion, yellow rattle, self heal, wood betony, knapweed, vetch, cornflower, etc. Big thanks to Amanda Lake for organising a clearing of nettles and thistles along the perimeter railings to avoid being sprayed with glyphosate by CEC parks (now banned). Meadows areas were cut by CEC parks at the end of October and raked by volunteers.

Learnington Walk wildflower meadow – Tim Duffy acquired hundreds of plugs, planted on 29 July.

Volunteers

Alison Carr leads volunteers on the last Saturday of the month, but more volunteers are needed. Work includes clearing benches of weeds and undergrowth, collecting litter, and other tasks. A big thank you to Alison Carr for leading the teams.

Relaxed mowing/biodiversity

David Kyles' (CEC) agreement with mowers to reduce mowing areas led to a large increase in unmown areas making a significant difference to insect habitat and increase in low level flowering.

Bird Enclaves/hedgerow/copse planting

FoMBL have now had agreement to establish two new bird enclaves at the toddlers' playground next to tennis courts and at the fenced Links wildflower meadow. Low bushes including hazel, hawthorn, blackthorn, juniper and dog rose have been ordered for autumn planting. David Kyles has now linked with James Gillespie's school to involve children to help with planting areas near the school. Funding by Million Trees project.
